

Have supervised or worked with you or have been your personal tutor for a minimum of 3 weeks and

EITHER

- a) A faculty member of your medical school, or
- b) A Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine or Duke-NUS GMS appointed clinical tutor; or
- c) At least hospital registrar or equivalent, or lecturer or higher.

Please note that the deadline for submission of referees has been extended to 24 September 2011.

For graduating seniors from YLL-SOM and Duke-NUS GMS, one of the 4 referees will be the Dean of the respective medical schools who will submit their letters of reference directly to MOH/MOHH. Such applicants will only need to identify 3 referees. Please note that your referee need not be from your SIP posting and can be from any posting in the clinical years of your course. Referees are not expected to base their opinion for clinical work only but other work and character attributes as well. Graduating seniors can select referees from the large pool of personal tutors. Your referees' comments are to facilitate the overall assessment from a different vantage point or perspective which is not necessarily all about proficiency in your specific clinical performance.

If however YLL or Duke GMS graduating seniors are unable to get all three referees by the deadline, they should submit their application nevertheless and not be overly concerned as the inputs from the Dean's office suffice to cover for any shortfall of referees.

For all other applicants, the requirement to identify 4 referees remains unchanged.
